Chef and owner of Fresh butcher deli cafe, Mike Dunlap, is thrilled to be a part of Meat the Need. Fresh is a small, family run shop in Broadview Heights that thrives as a result of community support. Mike believes strongly in giving back and being a part of the local community, and he's happy to offer his butchering skills and expertise to this wonderful project. If you donate a deer to the Human Services Department, Mike Dunlap will deduct the cost of the deer tag from his fee for any additional deer you wish to be processed.

RECEIPIENTS:

Broadview Heights Food Bank is a local service that provides emergency food to its residents. Our mission is to alleviate hunger and malnutrition in our city by distributing donated venison and dry goods to those in need while providing a meaningful outlet for sportsmen to help their community.

How does it work?

Sportsmen bring their tagged, legally harvested deer to Mike Dunlap, who is an Ohio licensed and registered meat processor. He will process the meat and grind the venison into burger, package and store it for our food bank.

Only entire deer can be presented for donation.

To participate in the donation program, hunters and processors must adhere to specific standards designed to prevent food-borne illness:

- Hunters must sign a form indicating their willingness to donate the deer and their adherence to the field dressing procedures outlined in this brochure.
- Processor will only accept deer that are:
 - Free from signs of illness
 - Field dressed with the hide intact
 - Free of visible decomposition or contamination
 - Properly identified with a Ohio DNR registration tag
- Processor will reject deer for the donation program that appear to have been mishandled in any way.

HUNGER FACTS:

In The United States, 1 in 6 people are faced with hunger. In addition, Nearly 1 in 5 Cuyahoga County residents of all ages lives below the poverty line, while more than 1 in 4 children under the age of 18 lives below the poverty line.

The hidden nature of hunger and poverty makes us less aware of its prevalence in the suburbs but hunger does exist and is growing. These are often hard working adults, children and seniors struggling to make ends meet by foregoing proper nutrition
