Mrs. Parsson stated that in December the Federal Government did announce that they will start mailing at-home COVID tests for free to any US household that requests one. AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE ELECTORATE OF AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE XI, SECTION 2 OF THE BROADVIEW HEIGHTS CHARTER PROVIDING THAT THE 4.2 MILLS LIMIT ON THE LEVY TO FUND FULL-TIME FIRE AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL BE CHANGED TO A RATE NOT TO EXCEED 5.8 MILLS FOR EACH ONE DOLLAR OF VALUATION ON ALL PROPERTY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. 
ADJOURN
