MAILBOX REPAIR

Mailbox damage is inevitable when streets are being plowed. Typically, damage is not caused by direct contact with the plow, but rather the snow that is thrown off the road. The snow is very wet and heavy and can strike the box with considerable force. It is important that your mailbox be in good condition, securely attached to a substantial support at the proper height, and at the proper distance from the roadway. Custom-made mailboxes should be shielded or replaced for the winter with a standard box. The Service Department will make repairs or replace mailboxes that have been damaged by snowplows.

SNOW SAFETY TIPS

The City of Broadview Heights Snow Crew would like to remind everyone of some tips to aid in snow removal from city streets.

Do not allow children to play in or around snow piles or to make snow forts in the public right of way (the area between the sidewalk and street and cul-de-sac islands).

When cleaning driveway approaches and sidewalks do not put snow in the street.

Stay back at least 75 feet from the rear of any plow truck and do not pass snow plow trucks at any time.

Please help us help you get to where you are going safely.

Who clears sidewalks and driveways?

Both are the responsibility of residents and property owners. The City appeals to citizens to keep this critical part of Broadview Heights' system moving by clearing sidewalks, especially for children walking to and from school. State law protects property owners from any added liability if they shovel their sidewalks. Residents should shovel snow into the yard, not into the street because it causes dangerously slippery conditions for both motorists and pedestrians. City crews try to avoid putting large piles of snow in front of driveways, however, this is not always possible. To avoid having to double shovel, you may want to wait until after your street has been plowed to the curb before you clear your driveway.

Cul-de-sacs

Cul-de-sacs are the most time-consuming streets to plow. It can take up to eight times longer to plow a cul-de-sac than it takes to plow a through street of the same size. Cul-de-sacs are also more difficult to clear and generate the most complaints because of the limited space to dump snow without burying driveways, mailboxes, and fire hydrants.

WINTER MAINTENANCE

Winter is here and we are all spending more time indoors, it is time to make sure your home is prepared properly. Colder temperatures can create multiple issues that can be prevented and will save your pocket book and maybe a life. Here is a short list of items to check on or maintain before the freezing temperatures start.

1. Have your HVAC system serviced and cleaned. If connected to the chimney, this is also the time to have the flue liner checked and repaired if necessary. Furthermore, have the flue for the hot water tank check as well. It is also recommended that fireplace chimney cleaning and sweeping also be done.
2. All smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors should be updated and replaced if necessary. At minimum, all batteries should also be replaced. Smoke detectors should be placed within each bedroom and an additional one per floor.
3. Exterior maintenance items should include: gutter cleaning, trimming low hanging limbs or large limbs overhanging power lines (call CEI) or overhanging the house, cleaning snow and ice from roofs and trees (always use a telescope rake and stand a safe distance away), winterizing any exposed waterlines including hose bibs.

Remember your health and safety should always come first, so don't be afraid to ask for help. Always try to stay ahead of the heavy snow falls by shoveling multiple times before it builds up and becomes too much to handle.

HEAP APPLICATIONS

HEAP APPLICATIONS FOR 2024-25 is a federally funded program administered by the Ohio Development Services Agency (ODSA). It is designed to help eligible, low-income Ohioans meet the high costs of home heating. HEAP pays a one-time payment for most PUCO-regulated utility customers reflecting their usage for the current winter heating season. Apply via mail to Energy Assistance Programs P.O. Box 1240, Columbus, Ohio 43266-0583. HEAP applications can be downloaded from the ODOD website at www.development.ohio.gov or picked up at community action agencies, post offices and libraries. Note: Each household should mail only one application.
