This Sunday, we will be celebrating one of the most important days of the year- Mother's Day. Some of you are too young to know who Erma Bombeck was, but I know that others of you do remember her for her seemingly-innate ability to turn her life as a suburban housewife and mother in the 1950's and 60's into a satirical observation of the "jobs" women were doing inside their own homes day in and day out. Erma brought humor to the everyday lives of women who did not work outside of the home, and she wrote with such sincerity and heart that her readers knew very well that her humor was never meant to be hurtful or be mean-spirited. Her columns were quite the contrary.

One of my favorite Erma Bombeck pieces is called "A Mother's Love", because it encapsulates all the things we love and remember about our moms.. My wife and I have been lucky to have two of the best mothers one could ever hope for. Both raised large families, often on a shoestring budget. They helped us with our schoolwork, cooked our favorite meals, and made us homemade birthday cakes. When we were excited about something or did well , they celebrated with us. When we were sad or disappointed or hurt, they cried with us. And when we made a poor choice, they let us know it.

Raising children is the perfect combination of joy, sadness, and exhaustion. Sometimes those emotions can change within a five-minute period. With kids, you are most certainly NEVER bored! As you read the words of Erma Bombeck (below), my wife and I would like to thank our moms, Jean and Darlene, for always loving us unconditionally and for never giving up on us.

And Happy Mother's Day to all of you, too! No matter how you became a mom, your dedication and endless love for your family does not go unnoticed.

Someday, when my children are old enough to understand the logic that motivates a mother, I'll tell them...

I loved you enough to bug you about where you were going, with whom and what time you would get home.

I loved you enough to insist you buy a bike with your own money, which we could afford, and you couldn't.

I loved you enough to be silent and let you discover your hand-picked friend was a creep.

I loved you enough to stand over you for two hours while you cleaned your bedroom, a job that would have taken me 15 minutes.

I loved you enough to say, "Yes, you can go to Disney World on Mother's Day."

I loved you enough to let you see anger, disappointment, disgust, and tears in my eyes.

I loved you enough not to make excuses for your lack of respect or your bad manners.

I loved you enough to admit that I was wrong and ask for your forgiveness.

I loved you enough to ignore "what every other mother" did or said.

I loved you enough to let you stumble, fall, hurt, and fail.

I loved you enough to let you assume the responsibility for your own actions, at 6, 10, or 16.

I loved you enough to figure you would lie about the party being chaperoned, but forgave you for it...after discovering I was right.

I loved you enough to shove you off my lap, let go of your hand, be mute to your pleas and insensitive to your demands...so that you had to stand alone.

I loved you enough to accept you for what you are, and not what I wanted you to be.

But most of all, I loved you enough to say no when you hated me for it.

That was the hardest part of all."

There have been many voting location changes in Cuyahoga County. All voters are advised to check their voting information prior to casting their ballots. Voters may Vote-by-Mail, Vote Early In-Person or on vote on Election Day. Vote-by-Mail Ballot Applications, and Early In-Person Voting hours are on the Board of Elections website: boe.cuyahogacounty.gov. You may also call the Board of Elections to request a Vote-by-Mail Ballot Application: 216-443-VOTE (8683).

COMMON QUESTIONS, PROBLEMS, OR ISSUES HOMEOWNERS HAVE

The Building Department wants to answer some of the most common issues and problems concerning homeowners.

- Make sure all tree limbs are cut away from sidewalks
- All sidewalks shall be maintained to prevent trip hazards of more than $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch or greater
- Make sure grass is cut in a timely manner. Must not exceed 6 inches
- Weeds in beds and throughout yard must be maintained
- Garbage must not be put at the street until evening of the day before pick up
- All Garbage and trash containers should be kept behind the front of the house
- Boats, trailers and campers must be parked behind the front building lot line
- Trip Hazards: Check sidewalks and driveways to make sure they are not more than $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch higher or lower than adjacent sidewalks/driveways.
- Clean moss growing on roofs and siding
- If installing a portable pool follow city guidelines
- If installing a gas line to your pool heater, outdoor fireplace, or grill it must be pressure tested and installed to all codes
- Grass may be cut, and yardwork done by homeowners from 8:00AM to 8:00PM
- Contractors may work from 7:00AM to 7:00PM Monday thru Saturday
- Check with Building Department to make sure your contractors are registered and permitted properly.
