MAILBOX REPAIR

Mailbox damage is inevitable when streets are being plowed. Typically, damage is not caused by direct contact with the plow, but rather the snow that is thrown off the road. The snow is very wet and heavy and can strike the box with considerable force. It is important that your mailbox be in good condition, securely attached to a substantial support at the proper height, and at the proper distance from the roadway. Custom-made mailboxes should be shielded or replaced for the winter with a standard box. The Service Department will make repairs or replace mailboxes that have been damaged by snowplows. Mailboxes hit by motorists are the responsibility of the homeowner. [View the Mailbox Replacement Policy \(PDF\)](#).


PART TIME RECREATION/ATHLETICS SPECIALIST Assist our Athletics Manager in performing supervisory and administrative duties for Athletic programs and events, serve as one of the Parks & Recreation liaisons with the community. Responsible for the efficient operation of assigned programs and athletics through coordination with contractors to provide programming and staff. Orders and distributes equipment and uniforms, schedules/re-schedules sports events and games, and tracks and monitors registrations and participation. Must be able to work a flexible schedule, up to 25 hours/week.

CUSTODIAN Performs general custodial duties, including dusting, picking up trash, mopping, vacuuming, cleaning and restocking restrooms, setting up/taking down chairs, tables and equipment for meetings and events, and cleaning and sanitizing surfaces and equipment. Must be able to work independently and as part of a team.

LIFEGUARD Guard our indoor pools, lazy river and play feature. Work approximately 15-24 hours/week. Work is primarily Monday – Friday, DAYSHIFT and/or EARLY MORNING OPENER. Must be interested in working year-round, this is not a seasonal position. Must be at least 15 years of age and with certification as a Lifeguard.

PART TIME BUILDING DEPARTMENT CLERK Answers phones and greets visitors and performs secretarial and clerical duties: data entry, filing, research of permit history, preparation of invoices and reports, record maintenance. Monday – Friday, days, up to 28 hours/week. Requires excellent customer service skills and solid knowledge of Microsoft Word, Excel and Outlook. Experience with a building, zoning or planning agency preferred but not required.

CATCH BASIN UPKEEP

Catch basins collect storm water and release it into the municipal storm sewer system. Regular clearing improves drainage and helps to prevent flooding. Remember as you are maintaining your yards, to clear any leaves and debris so that rain water and melting snow can drain properly.

POOL ETIQUETTE

We would like to take the opportunity to remind everyone of a few basic rules for good pool etiquette, so everyone can enjoy the same space safely and respectfully.

- **No Glass or Food on the Pool Deck** Glass containers are not permitted on the pool deck. Broken glass can create a serious safety hazard for bare feet and eyes. Food is also not allowed on deck – even the smallest crumbs attract ants.
- **No Personal Grooming in the Pool Area, Sauna, Steam Room, or Spa** Please do not clip nails, shave, exfoliate, use loofahs or body scrubs, or perform other grooming activities in these shared spaces.
- **No Spitting in the Pool** Spitting, blowing noses, or introducing bodily fluids into the water is not permitted. Help us keep the pool clean and healthy for everyone.
- **Respectful Lane Sharing** Please share lanes and treat fellow swimmers with courtesy and kindness.
- **Bathroom Breaks Matter** Take regular bathroom breaks and never swim if you are experiencing diarrhea. This protects everyone's health.

ENBRIDGE GAS OHIO EAST WALLINGS ROAD GAS LINE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

Enbridge Gas Ohio will be replacing the gas mainline between Broadview Road & Skyline Drive. The project is expected to begin 1-26-2026 and reach substantial completion 5-29-2026.
