- **WYATT ROAD DETENTION POND:** In January 2019, the City hired Rudzik Excavating to construct the Wyatt Road Detention Pond. This project is intended to maximize flood storage along an existing stream to reduce the likelihood that more frequent, high intensity storm events may cause overtopping at the existing Wyatt Road culvert just downstream of the project area. The project includes the excavation and grading of a large flood storage area to the north of an existing stream and construction of an earthen berm and storm water infrastructure intended to attenuate more frequent high intensity storm events and provide storage for less frequent larger storm events.

- **BROADVIEW HEIGHTS COMMUNITY CENTER - Saturday, April 6, 9 AM-12 PM:** Residents can bring their private documents to be shredded on-site. RECREATION DEPARTMENT As the snow starts to melt; it is time to start thinking about outdoor youth sports in Broadview Heights. Over the next four months, we will have close to 2000 participants in our youth sports programs including soccer, baseball, tee ball, softball and lacrosse as well as new offerings in the works. Make sure you are signed up early so you are not left out of these fun outdoor activities. You can sign up online at www.bhrec.org or at our front desk.

Spring Soccer begins April 6 and will run for the next 6 weeks. In May, baseball, softball, and tee ball practices begin with games starting in June and running through July. - **A.A.R.P. FOUNDATION TAX PREPARATION:** This IRS-supported free tax service is offered on a non-discriminatory basis without consideration of race, religion, gender, disability, or sexual orientation. It is generally for those with low or moderate incomes and/or age 60 and older. Taxpayers do NOT have to be retired or a member of AARP. **Appointments for the Broadview Heights location are filled.** [Click here](#) for other locations/dates and more information about the requirements. Taxpayers need to bring 2017 tax returns, 2018 tax documents (1099s, W-2s, etc.), social security cards for taxpayers and dependents, and taxpayers’ drivers licenses or State IDs.
- **ITEMS THAT ARE NOT ACCEPTED AT OUR HAZARDOUS WASTE SERVICE GARAGE DROP OFF LOCATIONS:**
 - **LATEX PAINT** is NOT hazardous waste. Please dry it out at home and put with the regular trash with the lid off so the drivers can see that it is dried out. You can mix the paint with kitty litter, sawdust, or a purchased drying agent available anywhere that paint is sold.
 - **MEDICAL WASTE:** Unused medications can be taken to the North Royalton, Seven Hills, or Brecksville police departments and placed in the drug disposal box in their respective lobbies.
 - **CFL LIGHT BULBS** (the curly ones) should be taken to *Lowes, Home Depot, or Batteries+* for recycling (15312 Pearl Road; phone 440-571-0002 or 440-571-0016)
 - **FLUORESCENT TUBE LIGHTS** should be taken to *Batteries+*.
 - **PROPANE TANKS** (20 lb. regular grill tanks) can be taken to any business that sells Blue Rhino propane. Write “RECYCLE” on the empty tank.
 - **TELEVISIONS AND MICROWAVES** are NOT accepted in the computer round-up drop-off location! Tube televisions under 32”, flat screens under 50”, and

portable televisions can be taken to any Best Buy for recycling (please call Best Buy ahead, fees may be charged).

- **SINGLE-USE ALKALINE BATTERIES** can be safely discarded in your regular trash.

- **SNOW PLOW PERMITS REQUIRED:** Ordinance 840.01 states that “..Any person who contracts or performs snow removal services in the City, on other than his or her own personal property, and for compensation, shall make application to the Mayor's office for a snow removal permit for each snow removal vehicle used by such applicant in the City...” [Download the application and ordinances](#) pertaining to snow plowing here. If you hire a contractor, please make sure they are licensed in Broadview Heights.

CITY RULES & REGULATIONS

- **BUILDING DEPARTMENT REMINDERS:** All contractors performing work in the City must be registered. The majority of projects that require hiring a contractor also require a permit. Permits cards must be displayed on the property in a place visible from the street. Projects requiring contractor registration and permits also require inspections by the Building Department. Specific to roofers, an “ice guard” inspection is required prior to installing shingles. Contact the Building Department with any questions. 440-526-6864
- **MINORS CURFEW:** Per [Chapter 648.10](#) of the Broadview Heights Code of Ordinances the curfew age & hours are as follows:

Age	Hours
Through 12.....	Darkness to 6:30 a.m.
13 through 15.....	10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.
16 through 17.....	11:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., Sunday through Thursday;
16 through 17.....	Midnight to 6:00 a.m., Friday and Saturday

- **CURBSIDE RECYCLING GUIDELINES:** **Simply put, listed are the items that are recyclable:** Plastic Bottles & Jugs, Glass Bottles & Jars, Cartons, Metal Cans, and Paper & Cardboard. Throw away the lids in regular trash unless they are still on the original container (tightly). **When in doubt throw it out (in the garbage that is).** Click on this link for tips on recycling the right way [Cuyahoga Recycles](#). - **NOISE ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO OUTDOOR EQUIPMENT:** No person shall use engine or motor- powered garden, lawn or maintenance tools intended for repetitive use in landscaping in residential areas, typically capable of being used by homeowners, including garden tools, riding tractors, walking tractors and power mowers, between the hours of 8PM of any day and 8:00AM of the following day. **Note: Hours vary for construction and roadwork.**

- **TRIMMING OF TREE LAWN TREES:** Please help us be a “walkable” community by pruning the trees on your tree lawn. The Shade Tree Commission recommends a minimum height of 6’6”. This will help keep our pedestrians and bike-riders safe.
- **ALL GARBAGE IS TO BE PUT OUT BY 7AM:** Due to weather conditions, holidays, call-offs, etc. the normal pick up times will vary. Do NOT rely on the time that trash has been picked up in the past.
- **SOLICITING IN BROADVIEW HEIGHTS:** There are several ordinances that pertain to [soliciting in Broadview Heights](#). All ordinances are located on our [website](#).
- **NO OVERNIGHT PARKING ON CITY STREETS:** [Codified Ordinance](#) section 452.05(c) (1) prohibits parking on city streets between the hours of 3AM and 6AM. Per Codified Ordinance section 452.20 (a), signs are posted at city limits.
