MAY 7, 2019 PRIMARY ELECTION - Voters in Broadview Heights will cast ballots on a municipal zoning issue in the May 7, 2019 Election.

To make sure there are no problems on Election Day, voters should check their voting information to make sure they are registered at their current address. The deadline to register and/or update voter registrations is Monday, April 8, 9PM. Register online at <http://www.443vote.com>. Registration cards are available at the Board of Elections and all public libraries. Early voting is from April 9 through May 6 at the Board of Elections: 2925 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland. Early voting hours are posted on the Board's website. **Voters may also submit vote by mail ballot applications if they wish to vote from home.** [Click here for an application](#), call 216-443-VOTE (8683), or pick one up at any public library. Voters that plan to cast a ballot on Election Day should bring I.D. and [confirm their polling locations](#) as they have changed in Broadview Heights. Polls are open from 6:30AM to 7:30PM.

The Board is seeking poll workers to assist voters on Election Day. Poll workers are paid up to \$200.00 and may apply online or by calling the Election Officials Department at 216-443-3277.

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

The Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District provided the following reminders relative to recycling:

- **Plastic bags** can be recycled at many retail locations, including Giant Eagle, Lowe's, Marc's, Target, and Walmart.
- **Clean and empty:** Rinse residue from cartons, containers, bottles and jars or any other recyclable that may contain food particles. For example: greasy pizza boxes are not accepted.
- **Cardboard and paper:** Keeping paper and cardboard DRY is imperative for the recycling process. Flatten all cardboard boxes as well.
- **Don't wishcycle:** Don't throw everything into your recycling container in hopes it will be recycled! Recycling only these five core items is paramount: cans, cartons, glass, and paper along with plastic bottles and jugs.

- **ITEMS THAT ARE NOT ACCEPTED AT OUR HAZARDOUS WASTE SERVICE GARAGE DROP OFF LOCATIONS:**
 - **LATEX PAINT** is NOT hazardous waste. Please dry it out at home and put with the regular trash with the lid off so the drivers can see that it is dried out. You can mix the paint with kitty litter, sawdust, or a purchased drying agent available anywhere that paint is sold.
 - **MEDICAL WASTE:** Unused medications can be taken to the North Royalton, Seven Hills, or Brecksville police departments and placed in the drug disposal box in their respective lobbies.
 - **CFL LIGHT BULBS** (the curly ones) should be taken to *Lowes, Home Depot, or Batteries+* for recycling (15312 Pearl Road; phone 440-571-0002 or 440-571-0016)
 - **FLUORESCENT TUBE LIGHTS** should be taken to *Batteries+*.
 - **PROPANE TANKS** (20 lb. regular grill tanks) can be taken to any business that sells Blue Rhino propane. Write "RECYCLE" on the empty tank.
 - **TELEVISIONS AND MICROWAVES** are NOT accepted in the computer round-up drop-off location! Tube televisions under 32", flat screens under 50", and portable televisions can be taken to any Best Buy for recycling (please call Best Buy ahead, fees may be charged).
 - **SINGLE-USE ALKALINE BATTERIES** can be safely discarded in your regular trash.

CITY RULES & REGULATIONS

- **BUILDING DEPARTMENT REMINDERS:** All contractors performing work in the City must be registered. The majority of projects that require hiring a contractor also require a permit. Permits cards must be displayed on the property in a place visible from the street. Projects requiring contractor registration and permits also require inspections by the Building Department. Specific to roofers, an “ice guard” inspection is required prior to installing shingles. Contact the Building Department with any questions. 440-526-6864
- **MINORS CURFEW:** Per [Chapter 648.10](#) of the Broadview Heights Code of Ordinances the curfew age & hours are as follows:

Age	Hours
Through 12	Darkness to 6:30 a.m.
13 through 15	10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.
16 through 17	11:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., Sunday through Thursday;
16 through 17	Midnight to 6:00 a.m., Friday and Saturday

- **CURBSIDE RECYCLING GUIDELINES:** **Simply put, listed are the items that are recyclable:** Plastic Bottles & Jugs, Glass Bottles & Jars, Cartons, Metal Cans, and Paper & Cardboard. Throw away the lids in regular trash unless they are still on the original container (tightly). **When in doubt throw it out (in the garbage that is).** Click on this link for tips on recycling the right way [Cuyahoga Recycles](#). - **NOISE ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO OUTDOOR EQUIPMENT:** No person shall use engine or motor- powered garden, lawn or maintenance tools intended for repetitive use in landscaping in *residential areas*, typically capable of being used by homeowners, including garden tools, riding tractors, walking tractors and power mowers, between the hours of 8PM of any day and 8:00AM of the following day. **Note: Hours vary for construction and roadwork.**
- **TRIMMING OF TREE LAWN TREES:** Please help us be a “walkable” community by pruning the trees on your tree lawn. The Shade Tree Commission recommends a minimum height of 6’6”. This will help keep our pedestrians and bike-riders safe.
- **ALL GARBAGE IS TO BE PUT OUT BY 7AM:** Due to weather conditions, holidays, call-offs, etc. the normal pick up times will vary. Do NOT rely on the time that trash has been picked up in the past.
- **SOLICITING IN BROADVIEW HEIGHTS:** There are several ordinances that pertain to [soliciting in Broadview Heights](#). All ordinances are located on our [website](#).
- **NO OVERNIGHT PARKING ON CITY STREETS:** [Codified Ordinance](#) section 452.05(c) (1) prohibits parking on city streets between the hours of 3AM and 6AM. Per Codified Ordinance section 452.20 (a), signs are posted at city limits.
