IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR 2020

- **PLASTIC BAG BAN:** Cuyahoga County's Bag Ban has taken effect. Many grocery/convenience stores, retailers, service stations and drug stores will no longer give you plastic bags for your items at checkout. - **ANIMAL SHELTER/DOG LICENSING:** The County Animal Shelter receives almost 2,000 dogs per year from being picked up as strays off the streets and works to connect dogs of all kinds to loving owners. Having a license for your dog isn't only a law; it's also a lost dog's ticket home! SNOW PLOW PERMITS REQUIRED

Ordinance 840.01 states that "...Any person who contracts or performs snow removal services in the City, on other than his or her own personal property, and for compensation, shall make application to the Mayor's office for a snow removal permit for each snow removal vehicle used by such applicant in the City..." SERVICE DEPARTMENT

- **CURBSIDE TRASH/RECYCLING GUIDELINES**
 - Trash/recycling must be placed curbside the night before your scheduled collection. Drivers may not return to residences if materials are unprepared at the scheduled collection time.
 - Rumpke's service includes collection of six, 32-gallon cans or bags per pick-up (may vary by service region). Cans and bags should not exceed 50 pounds. Please do not place trash at the curb in boxes. All boxes should be broken down and bundled. Rumpke is not responsible for damaged or missing plastic cans or lids.
 - Please contact Rumpke at least 48 hours before your regularly scheduled collection to request a large item pick-up for acceptable large items, and/or excessive amounts of trash. Television

sets cannot exceed 32 inches for curbside pick-up. Any mattress or upholstered furniture must be completely sealed in disposable plastic for removal.

- Freon containing appliances require special handling procedures prior to pick-up. Please contact the Service Department at 440-717-4022.
- According to Federal law, Rumpke is not permitted to accept tires, liquids, combustible materials or any items identified as hazardous.
- Bulky materials including drywall, concrete, bricks, dirt or rocks are not acceptable.
- Drums, barrels, yard and household containers are not acceptable trash containers and will be assumed trash if placed at the curb.

- **DO NOT PUT GREASE, FATS OR OILS DOWN THE DRAIN, EVEN WITH HOT WATER!** These substances will harden and create a nasty blockage in your sanitary line and/or the main sanitary line. The hot water only temporarily heats it up and liquefies the grease. As the air temperatures have recently cooled, we are seeing more backups caused by fats, oils and grease being poured down the drain. This will cause sanitary lines to back up and cause a stinky mess in your home. To properly dispose of these items let them cool and congeal in the pan. Scrape as much as you can into the garbage and then wipe off what remains with a paper towel. This little extra work is minor compared to a sewage backup!
- **PLEASE HELP KEEP OUR NEIGHBORHOODS SAFE:** Criminals are on the lookout for properties that are poorly lit and offer the cover of darkness to gain undetected entry to a home. Please replace burned out light bulbs in lamp posts to illuminate your property.
- **THANK YOU!** There has been a noticeable improvement in our sanitary sewer system due to residents not flushing so called "flushable" wipes down toilets. The decreased use of "flushable" wipes has alleviated many clogging issues in the pump stations. We appreciate your continued cooperation!
