HOLIDAY LIGHT RECYCLING – Holiday Lights are considered as tangles and should not be placed in your curbside recycling. Tangles, such as holiday lights and power cords will cause problems and shutdowns at the local recycling facility. All broken, burned out strings of lights, power strips and power cords can be dropped off at the Service Garage off of Oakes Road. There will be a Recycle Bin outside with a sign. Place items loose in the Recycle Bin and take all bags and boxes home. Artificial trees, solar lights and outdoor spotlights are not accepted.

BE A RECYCLING AMBASSADOR! Applications Now Being Accepted for District's New Adult Education Program the Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District is now accepting applications for the new Cuyahoga County Recycling Ambassador Program. Cuyahoga County's Recycling Ambassador course is an advanced learning, recycling education and training opportunity for adults. The program offers participants an in-depth study of waste reduction, composting, and recycling. Recycling Ambassadors are trained to work in their communities and help improve recycling by serving as their neighborhood's "subject matter expert" on recycling. The course is offered 3 or 4 times per year and consists of four 2-hour classes, held virtually through online meetings. Classes, held in the evening on Wednesdays or Thursdays, are taught by Solid Waste District staff members. Virtual or in-person tours of recycling facilities, businesses and organizations are held quarterly as a continuing education component.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION TO KNOW The City of Broadview Heights has recently had a rash of car break-ins and vehicle thefts. If a vehicle is found unlocked, they rummage through it for any type of valuable. Please see the below tips to help avoid this from happening:

- Lock your vehicles
- Don't leave car keys or valuables in your vehicles
- Close your garage doors at night
- Lastly, if you have outdoor lighting on your garage or post, leave them on at night

REMINDER NO OVERNIGHT PARKING ON CITY STREETS: Codified Ordinance section 452.05(c) (1) prohibits parking on city streets between the hours of 3:00AM and 6:00AM. Per Codified Ordinance section 452.20 (a), signs are posted at city limits. PLEASE NOTE THAT DUE TO THE SEASON, THERE COULD POSSIBLY BE A PARKING BAN.

RECREATION CENTER CHANGES DURING ALERT LEVEL CHANGES BASED ON THE CURRENT WARNING LEVEL WITHIN THE OHIO PUBLIC HEALTH ADVISORY SYSTEM

Please review the information [HERE](#) regarding the changes that will take place at the Community and Recreation Center when Cuyahoga County is in each of the warning levels (1-4) within the Ohio Public Health Advisory System. The explanation of levels and the guidelines for each level are listed in the chart at the link above. The City's mask/facial covering policies will remain in effect at all 4 levels. PLEASE NOTE: If we go up a level, the action is immediate, if we move down a level, there will be a 5-day period until action is taken. For example, if the level is red and moves up to purple than immediate action must be taken to follow the guidelines under the purple level. If for example the level is purple and changes down to red, we must remain in the purple zone protocols for 5 consecutive days before we can change our protocol to the red level guideline.
