


THE POST OFFICE: Prior to Mayor Raymon Fetzek assuming office Broadview Heights had no postal facilities whatsoever and no identification. Mayor Fetzek went to work immediately to acquire these facilities, which are now located in the Avery Food Locker. When the City acquired these facilities we became a contract station. In May of 1963 we became a sub-station which means mail leaving this station is post marked Cleveland-Broadview Heights. With the present population growth of Broadview Heights we will have a separate postal building and a complete identification within two years.



RUBBISH COLLECTION: Prior to Mayor Raymon Fetzek assuming office the residents received rubbish collection once a month and not always on the designated date of collection. The residents of Broadview Heights now receive rubbish collection twice a month and on time, and at no additional cost to the taxpayer. This is a good example of reorganization and getting the best service for the least tax dollar. Mayor Fetzek promised rubbish collection twice a month in last campaign. His opponents said, "It can't be done."



GAS PUMPS: The City of Broadview Heights maintains in excess of 12 pieces of equipment requiring gas and oil. Prior to Mayor Raymon Fetzek assuming office the City of Broadview Heights purchased all gasoline and oil at the local service station for the regular retail price. When Mayor Fetzek assumed office he installed our own gasoline pump. The City of Broadview Heights now saves in excess of \$2700.00 per year in gasoline prices. This is a great savings in tax dollars.



A NEW SERVICE TRUCK: The City of Broadview Heights did not have a new service truck since the year of 1947. With this new truck services to the residents have been increased such as rubbish collection twice a month. Prior to this time your rubbish was collected once a month.
