


THE OLD HARRIS ROAD BRIDGE This bridge was condemned in the year of 1933. Over the years many serious automobile accidents occurred due to the poor condition of the bridge. No progress was made in 29 years until Mayor Fetzek became Mayor in the year of 1962.



THE NEW HARRIS ROAD BRIDGE A new Harris Road Bridge was constructed in addition to 1200 feet of highway extending to Royalton Road. The cost of this bridge was in the sum of \$163,000.00; however, the cost to the City of Broadview Heights was only \$25,000.00, and this sum is to be repaid by the City of Broadview Heights in four equal installments, thereby acquiring a major capital improvement to the area, and also eliminating a serious traffic hazard.



THE NEW HARRIS ROAD BRIDGE HIGHWAY: In addition to a new bridge 1200 feet of highway was constructed, guard rails installed for safety, the road was straightened thereby eliminating dangerous curves, and culverts installed to insure proper drainage.



RECREATION BUILDING: This building was started six years ago and never completed. The condition of its structure deteriorated to such a degree the City considered demolishing the building. Over \$9000.00 in material and labor completed the building. Many Civic Organizations and over one hundred citizens gave time and money to complete the building. The Civic Groups which donated money to the completion of the building were: The Democratic Club, The Fire Department, All Boy Scout and Girl Scout Troops through a candy sale, The Men's Club, The Kiwanis Club, The Assumption Sewing Circle. Mayor Fetzek, Councilman Bender, Gehring, Starks, Detwiler and Wood also donated a portion of their salaries to help make this project possible.
